WHAT IS AN RCRP?

For those exiting the criminal justice system, one supportive program offered by our member agencies is **Residential Community Release Programs (RCRPs)**. Also known as “halfway houses,” RCRPs are residential facilities that have been specifically designed to provide a safe, structured and service-rich environment to assist individuals nearing release with their transition back to the community.

ELIGIBILITY FOR RCRPS

RCRPs in New Jersey are all contracted through the New Jersey Department of Corrections. RCRPs are designed for adult men and women on inmate full-minimum status who are within 30 months of parole eligibility and who are approved by an institution's Classification Committee.
